

LAWRENCE COUNTY CONSERVATION DISTRICT BEAVER CONTROL PLAN

THIS PLAN IS EFFECTIVE FROM JANUARY 1, 2012 UNTIL JUNE 30, 2013. THE LAWRENCE COUNTY CONSERVATION DISTRICT WILL PAY \$10.00 PER BEAVER. THE LAWRENCE COUNTY QUORUM COURT WILL PAY AN ADDITIONAL \$5.00.

THE DISTRICT BOARD HEREBY DESIGNATES DEB LAMB AS THE BEAVER CONTROL OFFICER FOR LAWRENCE COUNTY.

BEAVER HARVESTERS MUST APPLY FOR APPROVAL BY THE LAWRENCE COUNTY DISTRICT AND BE APPROVED BEFORE THEY CAN BEGIN HARVESTING. THEY MUST HAVE THE FOLLOWING:

-CURRENT COPY OF HUNTING/FISHING LICENSE


-CURRENT COPY OF PHOTO ID

THE TWO ITEMS LISTED ABOVE MUST BE ON FILE AT THE LAWRENCE COUNTY CONSERVATION DISTRICT OFFICE BEFORE HARVESTING BEGINS. IF INFORMATION HAS NOT BEEN RECEIVED, THE HARVESTER WILL NOT BE PAID.


BEAVER TAILS WILL BE TURNED IN AT THE LAWRENCE COUNTY CONSERVATION DISTRICT OFFICE TUESDAYS AND THURSDAYS. THE BEAVER CONTROL OFFICER WILL OVERSEE THE HARVESTER CUT A "V" NOTCH IN THE ROUNDED END OF THE TAIL. THE HARVESTER WILL RECEIVE A FORM SHOWING HOW MANY BEAVER TAILS WERE TURNED IN.

A LIMIT OF 20 BEAVER PER TRAPPER PER QUARTER IS SET BY THE DISTRICT BOARD.

HARVESTER FORMS AND CHECKS WILL BE PRESENTED TO A BOARD MEMBER EACH FRIDAY FOR THE CHECKS SIGNATURE. THE CHECKS WILL BE MAILED TO EACH HARVESTER EACH FRIDAY AND EACH CHECK WILL LIST THE DATE AND HOW MANY TAILS WERE TURNED IN. AGAIN, PAYMENTS WILL BE MADE UNTIL THE FUNDING RUNS OUT.
